<sup>1</sup> Under ss. 229(1) and 262(1) of the *Elections Act* the chief Electoral Officer must be satisfied that all expenses reported by the official agent of a candidate are accurate and meet the definition of election expenses. The detailed review conducted by the Chief Electoral Officer may result in adjustments for a number of reasons including omission of expenses that must be reported as election expenses and inclusion of expenses that do not meet the definition of election expenses.
