Election Summary

Volume I, Statement of Votes & Statistics, published in January 2022 provides a detailed overview of the 41st Provincial General Election (PGE). *Volume II, Report on the Conduct of the August 17, 2021, Provincial General Election and Recommendations for Legislative Change*, published in May 2022 includes 20 recommendations for legislative change. Those reports are available on the Elections Nova Scotia (ENS) website (www.electionsnovascotia.ca). The following is a summary of the 41st PGE and its outcome.

On July 17, 2021, pursuant to an Order of the Lieutenant Governor in Council, writs of election were issued under the *Elections Act (the Act)* by the Chief Electoral Officer (CEO), for the 55 electoral districts in Nova Scotia ordering that a PGE be held on Tuesday, August 17, 2021.

On August 19, at the Official Addition, the Progressive Conservative Association of Nova Scotia (PC Party) was determined to have won the most electoral districts. Table 1 indicates the number of elected members in the electoral districts confirmed with the return of the writs of election for each registered political party and independent candidates.

One recount was requested and held for the electoral district of Glace Bay-Dominion at the Sydney Justice Centre on Monday, August 30, 2021, by presiding Supreme Court Justice Jamie S. Campbell. The results of the recount confirmed Mr. John White, PC Party, as the winning candidate.

Changes to Electoral Finance Legislation Since the Last Provincial General Election

The following list outlines the changes to the *Act* that impacted the candidates and registered parties:

- Remove the prohibition on advertising within sixty metres of a voting location.
- Extend the deadline for the destruction of all lists of electors (LOE) and informing ENS to 30 days after election day and further, a daily fine of \$50 for missing the deadline be imposed.*
- Remove the requirement for a candidate to have a bank account if the activity is less than \$500.
- Permit Official Agents (OAs) for registered candidates to accept donations received from writ day to election day and that the donations be eligible for personal tax receipts from the OAs of the candidates.
- Introduce an audit subsidy for registered parties up to \$1,500.
- Remove audit requirement for parties if less than \$500 spent during an election.
- Introduce a provision to include a candidate family and accessibility expense for incremental costs incurred during a writ period.

**All changes outlined above were implemented before the writ was issued, except for the daily fine for the destruction of the list of electors (LOE). A process for issuing and returning the LOEs is under development and the fines will be levied during the next electoral event.*

Recommended Legislative Change

Recommendation 1 – Definition of Third Party

The legislation for third party advertising during an election was introduced in 2012. ENS has conducted 3 PGEs since that implementation. Registration of a third party is in effect for an election. There are few restrictions on what entities may register. A concern by electoral administrators here and across Canada is that a third party that is active outside of their jurisdiction may influence electors.

It is recommended that the definition of a third party be amended to include the restriction to Nova Scotian entities or individuals.

166 (u) "third party" means a person or a group in Nova Scotia, other than a candidate, registered party, or electoral district association.

Recommendation 2 – Election Expense Reimbursement

The legislation that defines election expense does not differ for the amount of reimbursement and the maximum amount eligible for reimbursement.

It is recommended that the election expenses eligible for reimbursement should include those incurred during the writ period that meet the definition and are supported by documentation such as invoices.

The maximum expenditure will include all costs incurred in the period of 120 days before election day. This may lead to a situation when the maximum expenditure may exceed the amount defined in Section 260 of the Act. As an example, a campaign may spend \$100,000 on equipment which is not eligible for reimbursement and may create an "overspend" of total costs incurred.

It is further recommended that costs not supported by documentation (Section 233) are also not included in the reimbursable amount yet would count toward the overall spending limit.



Registered Parties Spending Limits, Reporting and Public Funding

Determination of spending limits for election campaigns and reporting of registered party election expenses are important components of the electoral finance regime in Nova Scotia. The *Act* sets out a formula by which registered party spending limits are established. Within 120 days of the date fixed for the return of the writs of election, the OA of each registered party is required to file a report of election expenses with supporting receipts and an independent auditor's opinion respecting the veracity of the report. There are no provisions in the *Act* for the reimbursement of registered party election expenses; the results of the votes cast during a PGE determine the amount of public funding a registered party will receive each year following the election (see Section 191 of the *Act* on Registered Party Public Funding).

Registered Party Election Expenses Spending Limits

Subsection 259(1) of the *Act* establishes the maximum amount a registered party may incur for election expenses as defined in Section 166(i) of the *Act*. In the 41st PGE in 2021, the election expenses of a registered party could not exceed the aggregate of \$2.66 multiplied by the number of electors in the electoral district in which the registered party endorsed a candidate. Table 3 shows the maximum election expense limits for the Liberal Party, NDP, and PC Party, that each had 55 candidates of \$2,044,038. The Green Party endorsed candidates in 43 districts, resulting in a spending limit of \$1,628,234. The Atlantica endorsed candidates in 16 districts, resulting in a spending limit of \$586,141.

Registered Party Election Expenses Reporting

For the 41st PGE in 2021 the reporting deadline for registered parties was December 29, 2021. All registered parties filed their reports within the prescribed time frame and these reports have been posted on the ENS website. A summary of election expenses reported by each of the five registered parties, including the portion of election expenses that was invoiced to those candidates aligned with their party, is shown in Table 4. These amounts are important because once invoiced to candidates, the expenses become candidate expenses which are considered eligible for reimbursement through public funding.

Registered Party Public Funding

The annual public funding a registered party is entitled to receive is based on the aggregate of the valid votes cast for all candidates endorsed by the registered party in the most recent PGE multiplied by \$1.862.

Table 5 shows that annual public funding registered parties received in from 2018 to 2021 based on the 40th PGE in 2017, and the revised public funding received in April and October 2022 that was based on the results of the 41st PGE in 2021.

In an election year, the amount paid to each party is increased if more votes were cast and prorated for the number of days remaining in the fiscal year. If fewer votes were received, the adjustment is made at the beginning of the next fiscal year.

Registered Party Audit Fee Subsidy

Under Section 14 of the *Tariff of Fees and Expenses (Tariff)*, the OA of a registered party is reimbursed for all or a portion of their costs for audit fees. Audits are required if the party's campaign spends over \$500. In an election year and annually, the amount of reimbursement a party may receive for their audit costs is the lesser of the actual cost of an audit or \$1,500.

Candidates

Section 167 of the *Act* requires each candidate to appoint an OA. Table 8 on page 15 lists each candidate and their OA as well as the date on which the OA initially filed their candidate's report relating to the election expenses with ENS.

Section 229 of the *Act* outlines the filing deadlines. The first OA submission due was the report of tax receipts, and all copies of issued receipts and return of unused, due on September 16, 2021. The full audited financial report including supporting documentation was due on or before November 15, 2021. An extension of up to 30 days could be requested and approved by the CEO. Of the 230 candidates, 34 requested and were granted an extension. The final report required by legislation deals with disposal of excess contributions was due after the ENS review was finalized.

The financial consequence for late filing of the full financial report, that was due on November 15, is a \$50 per day fine plus the nomination deposit of \$200 is not refundable. The maximum fine is the greater of the amount of the election expense reimbursement or \$500, depending on if the candidate was eligible for election expense reimbursement. In the 41st PGE, fines of \$33,800 were levied on 21 candidates' OAs. This compares to \$2,850 for 6 candidates' OAs in 2017. Table 6 provides a summary of the fines levied.

It is also important to note that a candidate who is elected is disqualified from sitting or voting in the House of Assembly under Section 263 of the *Act* until their required report is filed. All OAs for elected members filed their financial reports before their deadline.

The fines are levied as legislated. The submission may be filed in several stages, and dates are recorded at ENS. The financial report is considered complete on the last date the report has been received at ENS including:

- Completed forms as prescribed in the *Act*, including a declaration signed by the OA and the candidate.
- Audit report and invoice from the external auditor.
- Supporting documentation in hard copy format- original receipts, bank statements, leases, expense, tax receipts, timesheets, mileage logs, etc.

Every effort is made through reminders to the OA to have the file completed before the fines take effect. As necessary, certain grace periods are granted for courier/mail processing times, etc. These processing times or extraordinary circumstances are considered, and the fines may be reduced. All OAs receive the same level of support and communication, and every effort is made by the audit team at ENS to assist to have the file submitted to meet the requirements of the *Act*.

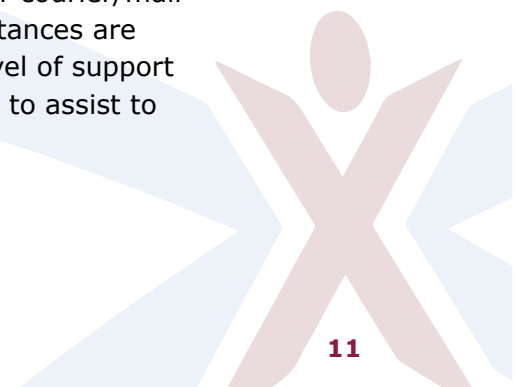

Responsibilities of the Official Agent

The OA of a candidate is responsible for all financial aspects of the campaign and is required to file reports with the CEO detailing election expenses, political contributions, and tax receipts. If the election expenses exceed \$500, the report must include an opinion provided by the auditor appointed by the candidate. Section 173 of the *Act* requires the auditor appointed by the candidate be a public accountant licensed in Nova Scotia under the *Chartered Professional Accountants Act*. Table 7 provides a listing of reports that must be filed by the OA of a candidate including the statutory reference, the audit requirement, and the filing deadline.

In 2021, all candidate OA training was delivered on demand and on-line. ENS altered its election planning to deliver the 41st PGE during the COVID-19 pandemic, and OA training sessions were developed by ENS staff and included the legislative changes that were proclaimed in May 2021. The training modules were posted on the website in June 2021. During the writ period, on-line meetings were set up with OAs for questions and answers and to provide highlights from the training modules. In addition to the on-line training and call-in sessions, videos covering highlights, or the OA duties and the nomination process were produced and posted on the ENS website as supplementary training aids. Videos were well received by those who took advantage of these resources. The quality of the financial reports submitted by those who participated in the training were superior to those who did not utilize these resources.

The quality of the reporting by some of the candidate's OAs was poor and included issues such as:

- The training offered was not taken by the OA for various reasons.
- There was a higher level of turnover where a new OA was appointed partway through the campaign or reporting period.
- The supporting documentation, as legislated, was not provided with the initial submission of the financial report.
- Issues with the OA accepting of contributions from non-residents, companies and through registered parties.
- Tax receipting for contributions was problematic and the quality of the reporting of tax receipts was poor.



Continuous Improvements for Official Agents

ENS is committed to the following process improvements for electoral finance reporting:

1. Work with registered parties to review and update the brochure *Thinking About becoming an Official Agent* that will better outline the responsibilities of the OA when recruited by the candidate.
2. Review and update the OA financial handbook to ensure it meets the needs of the user group. Collaborate with the parties and their volunteers to improve the handbook.
3. Review and update the OA non-financial handbook, including voting, role of scrutineer, advertising, campaigning rules, etc. Collaborate with the parties and their volunteers to improve the handbook.
4. Review and update the online training modules for the OAs. Collaborate with the parties and their volunteers to improve the training modules.
5. Work with the registered parties to identify the list of OAs to engage with in the period of approximately 6 months period leading up to the PGE.
6. Plan for in-person training in the months leading up to the 42nd PGE including the delivery of regional training to OAs and campaign managers.
7. Plan to provide an OA update communication to be issued throughout the election period including the writ period and post election period.

Candidate Campaign Election Expenses Spending Limits

Section 260 of the *Act* provides the formula for calculating the maximum amount that a candidate may incur for election expenses as defined in Section 166(i) of the *Act*. Table 10 shows the calculation of the maximum amount a candidate may incur for election expenses by electoral district. The average spending limit in 2021 was \$81,078 and the average candidate reimbursement limit was \$23,207. The final limit is based on the greater of either the preliminary or final number of electors on the list.

Candidate Reimbursement

At the time a candidate files nomination papers with the returning officer (RO), they are required to provide a deposit of \$200. The nomination deposit is returned to the candidate's OA if the financial report is submitted on or before the due date and ENS has received written notice that the LOE has been destroyed by the candidate and OA. In the 41st PGE in 2021, 230 candidates were officially nominated.

Following the 40th PGE in 2017, the CEO recommended the candidate nomination deposit no longer be required for fairness. This recommendation was made following a court decision in the province of Alberta: *Szuchewycz v Canada* (Attorney General), 2017 ABQB 645, in which the Court held that the provision related to the nomination deposit created a disadvantage on some prospective candidates that was limiting and unconstitutional. In *Volume II, Report of the Conduct of the August 17, 2021, Provincial General Election and Recommendations for Legislative Change*, the CEO felt it was prudent to include this recommendation for a second time.

Table 12, titled Categorized Candidate Election Expenses, provides the candidate reimbursements for the 41st PGE.

Candidate Audit Fee

Under Section 14 of the *Tariff*, the OA of a candidate is subsidized for all or a portion of their costs for audit fees. Audits are required if the candidate's campaign spends over \$500. The eligibility of a candidate to be reimbursed for audit costs is not conditional on receiving a minimum threshold of the valid votes cast in their electoral district. For the 41st PGE in 2021, the amount of reimbursement a candidate could receive for their audit costs was the lesser of the actual cost of the audit or \$851.52. Of the 230 candidates officially nominated 186 received reimbursement of their audit costs. Total audit fee reimbursements for the 41st PGE in 2021 totaled \$156,330 compared to \$118,835 in 2017.

Candidate Campaign Election Expenses

A candidate who receives not less than 10% of the valid votes cast in their electoral district is eligible to receive reimbursement of election expenses. The amount of reimbursement is the lesser of the maximum reimbursement amount, as prescribed in Section 267 of the *Act*, or the candidate's actual election expenses. The number of votes received by each candidate, determining eligibility for reimbursement of election expense is shown in Table 11. The maximum amount of reimbursement which a candidate may receive is shown in Table 10.

Summary of Candidate Election Expenses and Reimbursements

The election expenses report filed by the OA of a candidate receive a detailed compliance review by ENS. During an election, ENS engages a team of Chartered Professional Accountants who are experienced in audit processes to review each candidate file for completeness and compliance to the *Act*. The audit team works with each OA to ensure contribution, tax receipt, and election expense filings are completed accurately. Periodically, in the case of a candidate who is endorsed by a registered party, the party OA is asked to assist the auditor with communication with the candidates OA, as necessary. Common issues include contraventions to contribution legislation, issuance of tax receipts in error, and insufficient documentation supporting election expenses. The audit of candidate files was not complete until the end of November 2022, due to late filing and delayed responses by OAs through the audit process.

All expenses reported must meet the definition of election expenses in Section 166(i) of the *Act*. Pursuant to Subsection 262(1) of the *Act*, any payment of \$25.00 or more for election expenses must be evidenced by a detailed receipt. Also, all invoices for election expenses must be presented to the OA not later than 30 days after election day.

Table 12 shows each candidate's expenses as categorized in the election expenses report (Form 2-3E and 2-3F) as amended by the detailed compliance review and audit fee reimbursements.

Third Party Advertising

The *Act* requires third parties to register and report elections advertising activity, as well as limiting the amount a third party is permitted to spend. These limits are \$10,000 for a PGE and \$2,000 for a by-election, based on 2011 dollars and subject to CPI adjustment. The requirements are covered in Sections 275-284 of the *Act*. The requirement for registration is triggered when \$500 is spent by a third-party.

A limit of \$11,626.00 for each third party was set for the 41st PGE in 2021. Eight organizations registered as third parties for the 41st PGE and there were no contributions reported by third parties in the reporting period. Table 13 includes the names of the registered third parties, the date registered, the date the financial report was filed, and the amount spent.

The due date for third party reports was December 17, 2021. Two of the eight registered third parties met the reporting deadline. There are no fines for late submissions.

COVID-19 Pandemic Election Costs

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, ENS included public health measures in all aspects of planning for the 41st PGE in 2021 to ensure the safety of voters, election staff, candidates, and their campaign teams. Measures included extra supplies for personal protections (masks and face shields) and cleaning supplies (sanitizer and paper towel). Extra staffing was needed to assist with cleaning and helping voters to access voting locations safely. There were also extra costs related to shipping supplies and the leasing of returning offices early. All these measures added extra cost to the election.

The estimated extra cost for the 41st PGE in 2021 associated with the COVID-19 pandemic is \$1,916,000. Of this extra cost, \$1,216,000 is included in the election costs reported and \$700k was incurred in the previous fiscal period, and not included as an election cost.

Table 14 provides a summary of the estimated COVID-19 costs incurred before and during the election.

Returning Offices

Establishing Returning Offices

ENS does not maintain permanent locations for returning offices. Each RO is responsible for identifying potential returning office locations when directed to do so by the CEO. Leases for returning offices are usually executed following the issuance of the writs of election but this was done early for the 41st in 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the limited availability of suitable space.

The pandemic also caused shipping and supply issues. The *Act* requires returning offices to be established within 72 hours of the writs of elections being issued. To mitigate the risk of not having returning offices up and running in time, the CEO directed ROs to lease space for the 41st PGE in each of the 55 electoral districts for a period of 3 months beginning July 1, 2021.

Returning Office Staffing

Each RO is responsible for hiring election workers in their electoral district. The RO is required to appoint individuals to certain positions as defined by the *Act*. The rates of pay for election workers are prescribed in the *Tariff* made under the *Act*. An RO may hire additional election workers upon the approval of the CEO. Over seven individuals were employed in the 55 electoral districts during the 41st PGE in 2021.

Returning Office Costs

ENS makes every effort to record and report all costs associated with the delivery of an election. Costs associated with election service delivery can be categorized as direct costs and indirect costs (ENS overhead).

Returning Office Direct Costs

Direct costs are costs that can be specifically identified with a returning office. For reporting purposes costs are consolidated into various categories. Table 15 shows these categories and the type of expenditures that are consolidated within each category.

Returning Office Indirect Costs

Indirect costs are those overhead costs associated with election administration and election operations that are incurred by ENS as part of election service delivery. These costs are prorated based on the LOE and allocated to each electoral district returning office. Table 16 shows the type of expense categories which are reported as ENS overhead in Table 17.

Costs per Elector

The cost per elector is a calculation that allows a comparison of the total election costs for the 41st PGE in 2021 to the total costs of the previous PGEs. The total election costs are composed of three parts and incurred in the 2021-2022 fiscal year:

- Candidate election expenses and reimbursements
